When the Food Pantry returned to a parish-led operation in October 2023, John Ceisel stepped up to serve as our interim pantry manager. He volunteered more than just his time, he also shared his knowledge of food systems, and dedication to service.

Over the past six months, John has worked diligently with volunteers to keep the pantry stocked and open. They have rescued 40,000 pounds of excess food that would have been thrown away and fed 5,067 individuals who needed groceries.


Thank you, John for your commitment to our parish and our neighbors in need. You have truly taken Christ's words to heart:

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink..."




Food Pantry



It was a beautiful and powerful way to end the students' visit.

Interview with Br. Ayub Mwenda OFM, Conv.

What drew you to the Franciscans?
